
The Journey of Glassblowing

The craft of glassblowing is believed to have originated in the 1st century BC in areas now known as Israel, Iran, Palestine, and Lebanon.


Glassblowing was invented by Syrian craftsmen, where blown vessels for everyday and luxury use were produced commercially and exported to all parts of the Roman Empire.












